This is a great family event and even if you don't participate in the fishing it's a real spectator event. The fish have to be alive and wiggling to be weighed and measured. EURASIAN WATER MILFOIL

We were able to treat the Eurasian water milfoil one more time this year in early October. We feel that each year we gain on this invasive aquatic plant. We always hear from the Knolls and Randall Launch area concerning this aggressive plant problem. The shallowness in that area and quantity of boats kept to a narrow traffic pattern keeps the milfoil "motor cut" and floating on the surface. Our contractor, Marine Biochemists, has equipment that enables them to pressure shoot under the floating piers in an effort to control the problem. We find wherever there are a lot of boats the milfoil problem is greatest. Each plant cut becomes another plant.

FISH STOCKING

Fish stocking took place in early October. The DNR felt we needed more game fish and requested only Northern pike be stocked. 400 pike from 12 to 16 inches were released at a cost of \$2500 shared by the PL Sportsman's Club, Randall Township, and the District of Powers Lake. The fish were purchased from Keystone Hatcheries in Genoa City. We

had hoped the "Adopt-A-Lake" group from Randall School could watch the event but a conflict of delivery dates made that impossible. Gill Kroll

The district of Powers Lake meeting is Friday, January 7th at Randall Town Hall at 5 pm. See you then!




