Four acres of Eurasian Watermilfoil were treated October 11 and 12. Treatment is most successful when the water is calm and the sun is shining which makes it easier to detect what areas to treat. The scheduled dates don't always work out, but eventually the treatment is completed. That is what happened this fall with several false starts due to weather conditions.

#### LAKE STOCKING

1,000 smallmouth bass approximately a foot long were stocked in the lake on October 20. Stocking is a three-way commitment with the Powers Lake Sportsman Club, Randall Township, and the District of Powers Lake sharing the bill. You will remember in the last newsletter we






## LOW PHOSPHORUS FERTILIZER RESOLUTION

## WISCONSIN LAKES WORKSHOP

The SE Wisconsin Lakes Workshop will be on Saturday, February 18. The theme this year is *Troubled waters:* managing and restoring southeastern Wisconsin's lakes.

There will be sessions on: lake-scale restoration projects and tools; groundwater and lakes; rules and regulations for landowners – understanding permitting; and watershed/land use partnerships.

The sessions will include many first hand examples and there will be ample time during sessions and breaks to talk to those who have actually worked on projects similar to what you may be considering.
