The Lake Management District will once again be applying for a whole lake permit to treat the Eurasian Milfoil (EWM) this summer. In addition, we will continue to educate the community and lakeshore residents of our efforts to minimize the growth and spread of this invasive species.

53rd Annual Ice Fishing Derby Recap

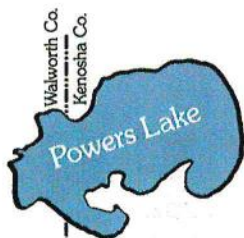
